Instruction

Gifted programming has been bustling this spring at Gust.

In the last few months, Ms. Forington has met with Kindergarten Explorers to learn some strategy games and how a deck of cards is organized. In first grade, we've learned how to methodically program small robots to follow a plan of action. Second Grade Explorers have collected and examined bacteria from different locations around the school. Third grade readers have applied "depth and complexity" tools to their novel study and conducted a Socratic Seminar on two related books. Third grade math students practiced area and perimeter by designing robots. Fourth grader readers have finished their novel study and held a poetry slam where they performed poems from the novel. Fourth grade math students have measured and compared the areas of the auditorium and gym. In fifth grade, the literature study of Freak the Mighty is about to conclude where we are analyzing themes of quests, archetypes and mystery. Math students have enjoyed new strategy puzzles and are building a crazy toy called a "hexaflexagon." Mathletes from 3rd, 4th and 5th grades competed in a national math contest and 4th and 5th graders performed in the DPS Shakespeare festival. Currently we have about 50 students formally identified as GT or HGT with about 50 more in our Talent Pool, including "magnet eligible" students. We have a thriving gifted population at Gust and it's growing every day. Thanks for all the support this year.
